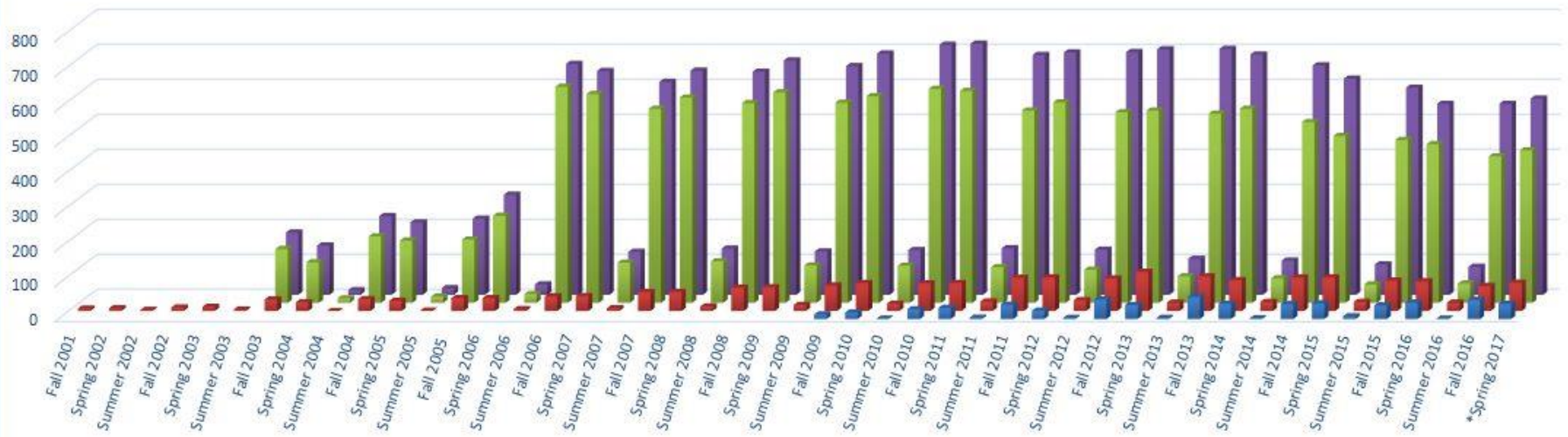

Course Sections - Per Term by Type

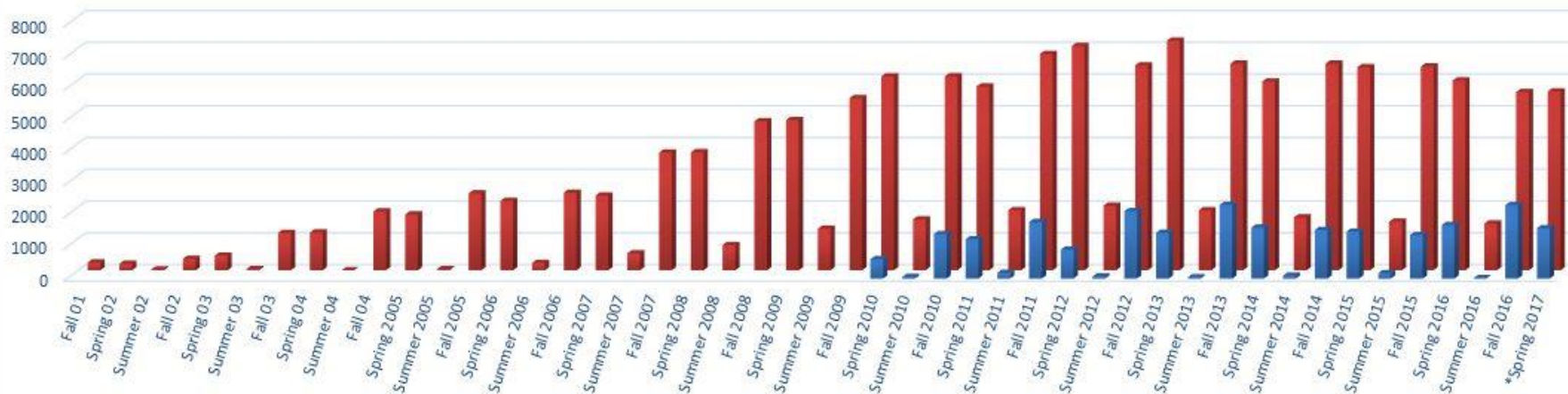

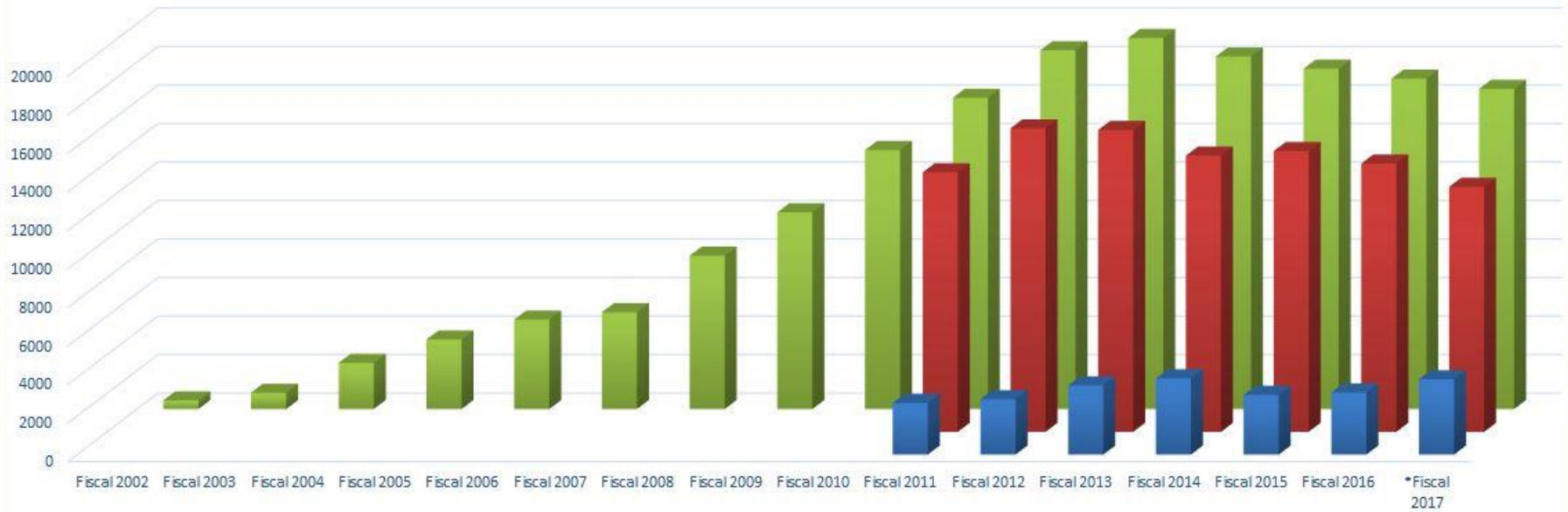

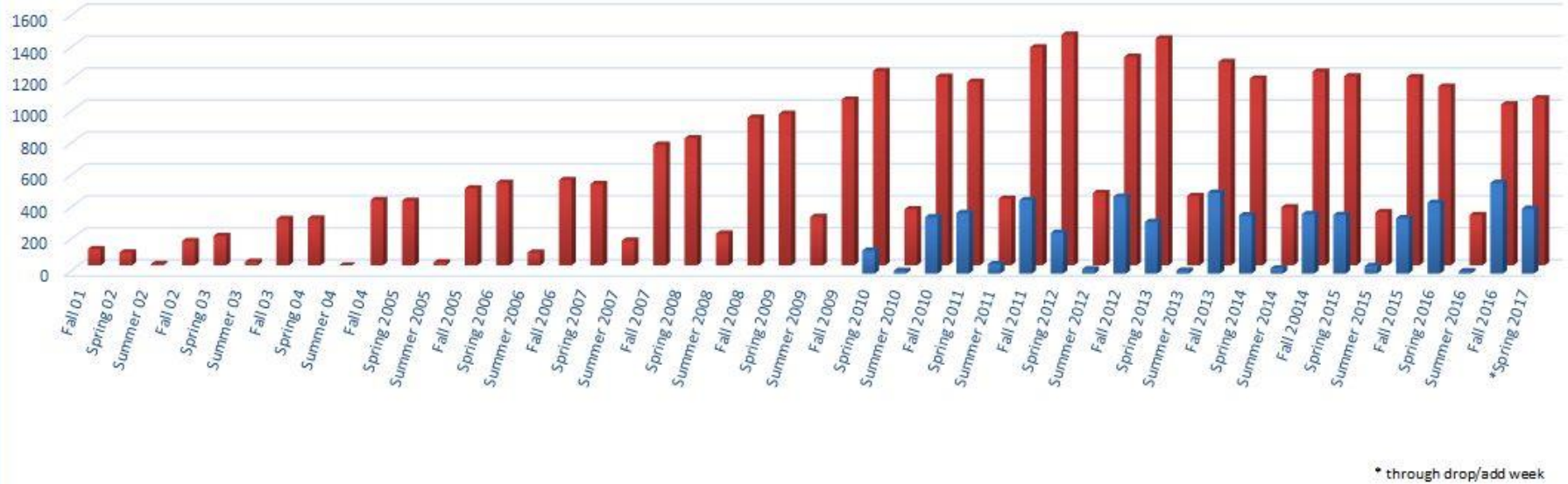
